PROJECT WORK

- **Activity:** * Water it daily and keep it in the sunlight.
- In your homework notebook, draw the plant's growth every 3 days for two weeks.
- Label the parts: Once the plant grows, label the Root, Stem, and Leaves on your final drawing.

Project 2: The "Hygiene Hero" Personal Care Kit

- **Task:** Create a mini "Care Kit" and a decorative Hygiene Checklist.
- **Activity:** The Kit: Find a small box (like a shoebox or an old lunchbox) and decorate it. Inside, place items that help you care for your body (e.g., a clean handkerchief, a comb, a small soap, a nail cutter).

Social Science

1. Do you live in a Nuclear Family (small) or a Joint Family (large)? Mention two benefits of living in your type of family.
2. Differentiate between a Kucha House and a Pucca House. Which one is stronger and why?
3. India is a land of many landforms. Name any two types of landforms found in India (e.g., Mountains, Deserts).

PROJECT WORK

Project 1: The "Grand Ancestry" Tree

- **Task:** Create a beautiful 3D Family Tree on a piece of cardboard or a large chart paper.
- **Instructions:**

i) Draw a large tree with many branches.

ii) Use real photos (if available) or draw faces of your family members: Grandparents (Roots/Bottom), Parents/Uncles/Aunts (Middle branches), and You/Siblings/Cousins (Top branches).

iii) Write the name and relation under each person.

Decorate the tree with green paper leaves or thumbprints.

Project 2: My Dream House Model

- **Task:** Build a small model of your "Dream House" using recycled materials.
- **Materials:** Old shoe boxes, matchboxes, bottle caps, ice cream sticks, and colors.
- **The Social Twist:** On a small card kept next to your model, write down the Address of your real home and your State and Country.
- **Note:** Make sure your model has windows for proper ventilation!
